The following is the general view of the situation: It is evident that the fortifications have been much strengthened as dince the last battle. The longer one looks at the place the more thoroughly does one feel the toughness of the Russian task. The position must be attacked as a whole and taken as a whole. If the northern ridge were taken and occupied the position of the central swell would not be materially impaired. Suppose a lodgement was effected on the central swell, that lodgement would be commanded by the northern ridge and redoubts on the south of the town. All that is wanted to make the Turkish position of the ridge in front of Radisova. Probably this was not undertaken, owing to the force available not being strong enough to hold so wide an area.
