It will be re-membered that John Sandfield Mac-donald's original scheme was the erec-tion of two or three prisons in different parts of the province and that the Reform Government modified this plan about the prison being kept tolerably full and therefore the Government believed they might safely venture to contract to furnish a certain number of hands at so much per day to the Can hands at so much per day to the Camana Car Co. The price fixed upon was afferwards found by the Company to be far too large, and when the latter became some time after insolvent a board of arbitrators was appointed to determine the amount due to the Government for prison labor. The commissioners sat for several weeks last summer taking evidence of various kinds and the Government case was conducted before them by the Provincial Secretary, who on behalf of the Province declined to abate anything from the original agreement. The decision of the arbitrators was, however, in haver of the Car Company, and in this way an apparent asset of the province was to a great extent wiped out. It is not easy to see what room for fault-finding there was in all this, nor indeed was there much real complaint indulged in with reference to the transaction itself. It was, however, made a peg on which to hang any number of loose charges of administrative blundering, not forgetting an occasional reference to the scandals of last year respecting the cruel treatment to which the prisoners were said to have subjected. The Government boldly took the ground that the prison was one of the best and most economically managed institutions of the kind in the world, and defended the course adopted Car Co. Of course the usual objections were urged against the employment of prison labor in the production of articles which would compete with the products of the ordinary free labor of the country, and there is undoubtedly great reason to be cautious in this direction.
