THE DISEMBARKATION AT HALIFAX.

The programme of the reception of the Marquis of Lorne and Princess Louise is about completed. The official landing will not take place until the day after their arrival. On landing, the vice-regal party proceed in state to the Province Building, where the Marquis of Lorne will be sworn in as Governor General by Judge Ritchie, of the Supreme Court of Canada. The city address will be presented immediately afterwards. His Excellency and the Princess will then proceed to Admiralty House. On that evening they will dine with the Lieutenant-Governor, and at 9:30 p. m. a drawing-room will be held at Government House. Next day his Excellency and the Princess will visit objects of interest in and around the city. At 3:30 p. m.
