Feeding Cattle on a Summer Pasture.
 When so many of our farmers sell their cattle at \$25 to \$30, and consider the latter a big price, too much can be printed in these columns to lead them to the fact that they are being sold at a low price. It can be done by giving attention and judicious enterprise, and it will be found much more profitable than the old style. We find in an exchange the following timely article on summer feeding, which we transfer to our columns: Cattle feeding is now undergoing a change from the former to the latter. Much more study is given to the quality of foods for the growth and fattening of cattle than a few years ago. Feeders begin to see that they have heretofore given little attention to variety in the rations of their cattle. The question which now arises is to consider how a better feed can be given while the cattle are on pasture. The addition of a few pounds of food to each steer while on grass would be all utilized in laying on extra fat, and would improve the quality of the beef for shipment by giving more solidity to the flesh; the extra fat being the place of the fat in summer feeding, the animals would then be much more in demand. The English, in feeding their cattle on grass, accompany them with four or five lbs. of oil-cake per head, in order to balance its carbohydrates with albuminoids. But the ration then is of more nitrogen than eight lbs. of corn or peas with pasture. The American feeder, when his green is always plenty, may therefore have a good ration, at less expense, by adding six or eight lbs. of corn or peas per head on good pasture. In fact the feeder's diet should be shown in the skill of combining rations. Nature here furnishes in rich grass a large proportion of albuminoids, and the feeder can improve the effect of this with a few pounds of corn or peas. And besides, this small amount of grain in the warm season will produce a much greater effect than if fed in the cold weather. The grass ration being so bulky does not furnish all the food which may be assimilated by the animal, and a little concentrated grain adds to the bulk but much to the assimilable food, and consequently increases in weight and value of carcass. Another important consideration is seen in the fact above mentioned, that the grain renders the flesh more solid—containing less water or more dry substance—and in consequence of this condition steers are not so liable to rot when being taken from pasture for stall feeding in the winter.

Best of feed for fattening to market.
 All observing feeders know that steers taken from a good pasture must be fed in stall for some time without much increase in weight, as the fat is laid on the frame of the animal, and the weight may be doing well for thirty or more days with but little increase in weight. But when the grain fed with pasture this shrinkage does not occur on being put up in the fall for stall-feeding. On the same principle cattle stall-fed through the winter, when taken to good pasture in the spring, will increase in weight very rapidly by the addition of one or two water to the carcass. We have known such steers to gain five lbs. per day for fifteen days after being taken to pasture. We know that some good feeders are averse to feeding grain in winter, because they think the steers depend too much upon the grain and do not eat so much grass. But we think their error has been occasioned by not considering the pasture we have given above, as to the effect of grain feeding on the quality of increase in weight. In sections where corn is cheap it appears evident to us that a small grain ration with pasture will pay 25 per cent. better for the grain than the same amount fed in cold weather.
