BUILDING NOTES.—Several of your Lindsay masons, in charge of Mr. John Milburn, are engaged erecting a large kiln at Penelon Falls for the purpose of burning the refuse and sawdust from the large mill of Mr. R. C. Smith & Co. on the south side of the falls. It was blasted out of the solid rock to a depth of about thirty feet of masonry and brick-work, making in all about sixty feet in height.
