MR. BLAKE'S SPEECH.

[From the official report—conclusion.]

Sir, Mr. BLAKE.—When the house rose at six o'clock I was saying that the select committee now proposed was a great improvement, as I judged, by precedent in several respects. The hon. gentleman pointed out the necessity of a select committee of members, because, he said, the laws of the different provinces in this particular respect differ somewhat, and it was well to collect them. The hon. gentleman himself has had to deal on former occasions with the varying laws of the provinces when he thought Dominion legislation was necessary—not the laws as of one particular matter, but the laws as to one small subject heretofore supposed to be of local legislation, not the laws as to one isolated question upon which there had been legislation in the various provinces, but to take the whole body of criminal law as it stood in the four provinces of the Dominion. Legislation was formed—or three provinces, because, of course, the old provincial law had its single criminal law. The hon. gentleman did not propose to a select committee to discharge the duty of investigating the various provincial laws upon crimes, seeing what their customs were, seeing what the mode was in which they had dealt with various crimes, and so avoiding the necessary preliminary to parliamentary action through the medium of a select committee of members of parliament, but he proposed to a select committee having been able to inform his mind and the minds of his colleagues as to what all the laws of all the provinces were, and to put upon another branch with stone tablets, Messrs. Thorburn & McTaggart are the contractors.
