A NARROW ESCAPE. On Friday night last Mr. Redmond Carey, who lives on the cast side of the river, had a narrow escape, with his family from being burned to death in bed. Iffs wife having been ill for some time past, it was necessary to keep a light burning all night, and the night of the ex-plosion it had, been left burning as usual, with the flame turned partly down. Some time during the night Mr. Carey was awakened by his wife screaming that the house was on fire. In a few minutes more it would have been, no doubt, but for the presence of mind displayed by Mr. C., who managed to extinguish the fire, having his hands badly burned in doing so. It appears after they had fallen asleep the fire worked down below the burner of the lamo into the oil, and the flame was bursting out of the chimney when discovered. The heat was so intense that part of the burner was melted away. Almost every one of our exchanges (save the Millbrook Messenger) has now and then an account of a fire turned down or the lamp filled too full of oil, either of which is very dangerous, though many are no doubt unaware of the fact, as the practice is almost universal of leaving the light burning with the flame turned down. The above accident will, we hope, prove a warning.


