NORTH VICTORIA. We learn from the notice in the Gazette that the North Victoria reform association holds its annual meeting at the Falls to-day.

THE PACIFIC "LOAN." The Pacific loan resolutions have been carried by a majority of 74 and 74. It has all along been felt that the large ministerial majority would vote through any thing proposed by the ministry.

The situation Tuesday and Wednesday was very critical for the government. The Quebec French members to the number of forty bolted in a body and refused to vote unless the "better terms" demanded by Quebec were once conceded.

Quebec, it is understood, is to get \$10,000 a mile for the road from Ottawa to Quebec City; the interest on four millions guaranteed for building a bridge at Quebec, and other important concessions, which will add ten millions or more to our outlay.

Public attention has been almost wholly attracted to Ottawa matters, and our summary of the Ontario legislative proceedings must stand over.

REPORT OF FINANCE COMMITTEE. The report of the finance committee was read by Reeve Deacon. The following accounts were recommended to be paid:

REPORT OF FIRE AND WATER COMMITTEE. COUN. CRANDELL moved that the report of the fire and water committee be adopted. This report was read at the meeting held two weeks ago and had been laid on the table for consideration.

REPORT OF TOWN PROPERTY COMMITTEE. COUN. GRAHAM, chairman of this committee, read the report stating in brief that the leases of market stalls had expired.

A RAILWAY PETITION. It was moved by Dep.-reeve FEE that the petition praying for redress in the matter of the Victoria railway be sent to the lieutenant-governor of Ontario.

TENDERS FOR A TOWN PHYSICIAN. COUN. CONNOLLY moved that the clerk be instructed to advertise for tenders for the position of town physician. The motion was carried.

THE TOWN BANK ACCOUNT. Dep.-reeve McFILLIS said that the motion carried at the last meeting of the council about changing the town bank account should have a chance, and later in the evening he called the attention of the council to the account he made by tender.
