HOME AND FOREIGN ITEMS OF INTEREST.

Some cases of genuine Asiatic cholera are said to have occurred in London.

Nemed, a Hungarian village, has been burned, and 230 houses were destroyed.

The death of the Duke of Noailles, as the age of eighty-three, is announced from Paris.

The wheat in north-eastern Saskatchewan is being destroyed by vast numbers of locusts.

Twenty-seven vessels have been injured during the recent month by icebergs in the Atlantic.

The Russians have bought up all the coal in Yokohama, and are making active inquiries for transport steamers.

Kingsford has demanded a license fee from the book publishers in connection with the literary conference.

It is understood that His Majesty's visit will commence in Regina on the 23rd June before His Majesty's departure for London.

The volunteers of India have been placed under the orders of the Duke of Connaught. They will receive allowances and wear scarlet uniforms.

A number of people were fatally injured, and a great amount of property destroyed in north-eastern Kansas on Wednesday by further cyclones.

A young man from Welland was instantly killed Friday morning by jumping over the precipice below the new suspension bridge at Niagara Falls.

Millions of grasshoppers are coming on the eastern coast on the Ontario and Arkansas river above Pueblo, devouring early vegetables and tender shrubs.

Eleven out of a party of seventeen Bohemians camping for the night in a canyon near Lincoln, Nebraska, were drowned on Tuesday evening by the bursting of a waterpout.

The official correspondents reporting the occupation of the Red sea ports of Egypt since the British have entered Turkey to occupy the ports from which gunboats were withdrawn.

There is a good deal of indignation felt in ecclesiastical circles in Paris over the secularization of the Pastoret and the government order to demolish the building within forty-eight hours.

A very active red insect has appeared in some of the vineyards of Solo county, Cal., in immense numbers covering the vines in some places. A vine attacked by this new pest droops in an hour.

A French fishing boat was run down and sank during the fog on the 23rd May by the steamer City of Rome, bound from Liverpool to New York, and which was on her way of twenty-four drowned.

The British war authorities have decided to transport a large number of torpedoes and other munitions of war from Halifax, N. S., to British Columbia for the defence of Victoria and other harbors on the Pacific coast.

While Dr. Demour, farmer of L'Islet, was plowing during a recent storm, his two horses were killed by lightning. Mr. Demour was thrown to the ground in a tremendous state, as was also a boy who was holding the reins.

Great excitement has been caused by finding in a mill-stream in Elms Grove, France, the body of a child who had been hidden behind her back. It is believed the girl was murdered by her step-mother.

A project has been started at Wells, Me., to erect a statue in honor of the patriot of supplying the Boston market. The committee is established to consist of two hundred acres of land, and the idea is to work it as a living monument to the patriot.

Numbers of houses on the banks of Waco creek, Texas, were swept away on Wednesday night by a sudden flood, caused by a furious rain storm. The water, carrying away many cows, drowned, enormous damage was also done to farms, crops, and railroad property.

George Caldwell of Philadelphia has been acquitted of the murder of Walter Scott Brown. Caldwell is the person who shot Brown in the back of the head on the night of the murder. Caldwell picked up a little piece of coal about the size of a walnut, threw it and struck Brown behind the ear of a carriage. Caldwell's conviction was based on the fact that he had a pocket containing a piece of coal.
