THE QUEBEC ELECTIONS. The Quebec provincial elections have resulted in the defeat of the Ross-Tailon-Chapleau combination. There seems to be little doubt that Mr. Mercier has a majority of nearly a dozen, after giving the government the benefit of several doubtful votes.

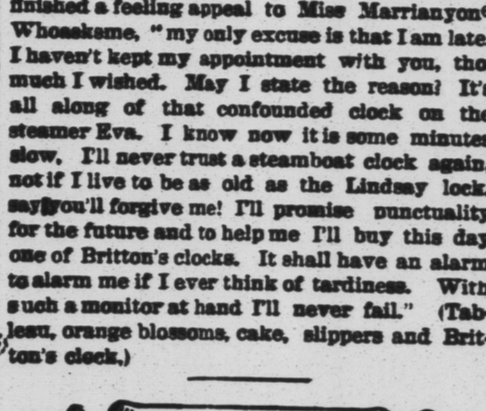
The Montreal Herald in discussing the result of the Quebec elections says:—"This great victory of honest government," and for the punishment of maladministration continued for many years is very cheering. It is particularly so in view of the extraordinary preparations that were made to debauch electors.

The defeat of the local government shatters the last hope of the tory phalanx from Quebec which has so long been the mainstay of Sir John Macdonald's administration. Quebec is lost; New Brunswick and Nova Scotia gone; where can Sir John get his majority?

EDITORIAL NOTES. Mr. Ulrich Wilson is the tory-temperance-Scott-act candidate in Lennox, and as such is ardent and zealous in talking for the temperance cause; but when as mayor of Napanee he is called upon to try two Scott-act cases, as the law provides, he persistently refuses to discharge his magisterial duties.

The Ingwell Sun says:—"Nearly every reform paper in Ontario has been the firm friend of the Scott act, and has fought manfully for its adoption. We can now recall but few that came out in active opposition to the act, and they are obscure in their influence. On the other hand, we know of scarcely a conservative paper that supported the act, and the large majority of them openly opposed it.

There will be more issues in the coming election than that of temperance, important as that may be. An important question is that of extravagant expenditure of the public money. Why should there be
