weight. Should the measured bushel give two or three pounds over weight he gets nothing for it, as in the case this summer. If he measures and weighs an amount with him he has to satisfy the scales of the buyer, as to color which may—and often does—all the virtues of weight.

Let barley be sold and bought at market rates per 100 lbs. It is not even the measure of weight—it is worse than useless. Pay the price per 100 lbs. Then pay so much per 100 lbs. for color. If there is a premium for color it is not to be paid. By paying best price for best color and so on there would be some remuneration to farmer who has no chance of getting it now.
