Victoria and Montreal.

A deputation from the county council of Victoria, comprising Messrs. C. D. McEachern, Warden, Thomas Broad, reeve of Mariposa, W. Cameron, reeve of Woodville; Col. Donohoe, dep. reeve, Lindsay; Robert Kennedy, deputy reeve, Verulam; and Mr. J. H. McNellis, secretary of committees, county council, waited upon Attorney-General Dowd on Friday afternoon and presented a memorial praying that they should be returned to the district of Victoria. Col. Donohoe furnished statistics showing that the amount expended in the district of Victoria was greater than the revenue received from them, and asked that they be created into a separate organized municipality. The Attorney-General replied that he would refer the matter to the committee on the subject. Some portions, he said, of the district were so poor that the population was not large enough to support a municipality. He would, however, consider the petition. The deputation took advantage of their being in Toronto to have a letter from Mr. Harty regarding the district which they had presented to the Attorney-General. They have failed to pay over any money to the district, and the Attorney-General has directed these moneys to be paid over to the county treasurer. The deputation is now in Toronto on their way back to Victoria. It is being organized to see the Attorney-General.

Scott Act News.

Information was laid this week against J. F. McCabe, Dominion hotel, of an infraction of the Scott Act. The charge being admitted a fine of \$50 and costs was imposed.

At Port Hope last week five amounts to \$300 were imposed upon violators of the Scott Act. One of the offenders was from Garton Hill, one from Bellefleur, one from Centreville and one belonged to Port Hope.

Information was laid this week before Police Magistrate O'Leary charging Tom McCosken of the Royal Hotel with an infraction of the Scott Act. The charge was admitted, and being a second offence a fine of \$100 and costs was imposed.

At Fenelon Falls this week several cases of infraction of the Scott Act were before Magistrate Dickson, J. P. W. Light was fined \$20 and costs, and a second offence was fined \$100 and costs, and a third offence was fined \$100 and costs was imposed.

At Woodville three charges of infraction of the act were heard before Mr. H. Adams, J. P. One was fined \$50 and costs, C. Tompkins, Cambridge, \$50 and costs and a charge against Mr. H. Campbell of Kirkfield was heard and dismissed.
