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The large farms of land north of this place, Muskoka, Haliburton, Kilmont and Bobcaygeon districts, are admirably adapted for sheep raising, and those lands can be procured very cheaply.

Now, what are our future prospects for profitable sheep raising? I say excellent, if we can only get a free market for our wools, lambs and mutton at our American neighbors south of us.

In December, January and February nine months lambs when fat readily find customers from \$9 to \$7 each. What can a farmer raise to pay so well as so small a cost of labor and first outlay in so short a time, and at the same time increase the fertility of land which has produced too much wheat in the past, and which in the near future, will be grown for our use in the west?

And now, without offending anyone, I suppose it is right for me to say which breeds of sheep I should recommend. My answer is, study the American requirements, and you will have already anticipated their wants and tastes, and there is no breed which we have to excel the various breeds of the Downs. They are hardy, plump, lean meat producing sheep. Their carcasses is the best selling meat in any market, and their wool is so well adapted for the inhabitants of this hemisphere, where so much flannel is used all the year round.

There is another favorable consideration which should be taken into account, viz., that this principle in particular is the best sheep breeding ground on this continent, so that in the future, as in the past, we can drive a greater profit than I have shown in supplying pure bred, healthy breeding sheep to our own kinmen to the east and west of us, and to our gallant cousins residing south of latitude 45°.

This plan of Prof. Robertson coincides with the advice of our old friend Mr. G. Gilbert, who has frequently urged members of the Society to grow more sheep.

The winter is going to be a trying one on cattle and profits; but if our threatened disasters, which in some sections have been already too intensely realized, do not awaken the stockmen and general farmers of Ontario to a prudent course of preparation for the future, the losses will have brought equivalent compensation.
