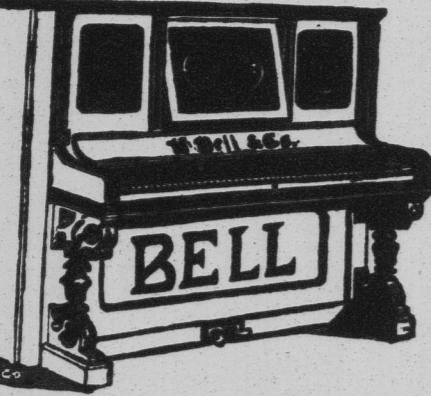

LOCAL MATTERS.

MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS.

Lindsay—Mayor Walters elected—Reeve Grandall, Dep. Reeves Williams and Ray—Some disappointed. Fair sleighing and fine weather made Monday a lively day for the municipal elections, and the candidates were hard at work from early dawn to dusk. At five o'clock a halt was called, and the verdict awaited with profound interest, while the returning officers totted up the returns. When the result was known there was the usual cheering and congratulations. The band serenaded the victorious candidates. A public meeting was held in the town hall and the successful men heartily thanked their supporters. The utmost good humor prevailed. The unsuccessful ones took their defeat philosophically. The results were in many cases "unexpected." A larger majority was expected by his friends for Mayor Walters, but he had more than enough to get there—and quite a respectable figure in addition. Mayor Walters has done good work for the town; and this year will prove that he is fully worthy the popular confidence reposed in him. The veteran "Squire" made an exceedingly good run under the circumstances. The contest between Capt. Crandall and Mr. H. Walters was surprisingly close and keen. The latter was defeated through over-confidence. The captain is a tireless canvasser. The additional vote for the high school was also against Mr. Walters in certain quarters, though he was in no way responsible for it. Mr. Thos. Fein joined his own cause with his fly-sheets and reckless charges. The race between the four candidates for the second deputy-reveeship was highly interesting. Mr. Ray was ahead and will make a capable representative at the council board and in the county council. Mr. Mallon's large vote was a genuine surprise to almost everybody except himself. Mr. Connolly has done an exceedingly useful councillor and deserved promotion. For councillor in the south ward Mr. H. B. Dean headed the list. For this he is partly indebted to the Warder; mainly, to his own personal popularity. The Warder's bitter and unfeeling attack gave Mr. Dean a good many votes. In fact candidates supported by or praised by the Warder "got left," while those condemned by the Warder were "got right." That is quite noticeable in Lindsay, as well as in Mariposa. It is suspected the Warder man gave strong praise to one candidate with a view of securing his defeat—amongst Protestants; and in another case a shrewd candidate begged him for heaven's sake to give him half-a-column of abuse and insults to "make his election sure." Singular, but true. Such is life.
