Four hundred families have left Limerick, Ireland, for Buenos Ayres. Mr. Ignatius Cockbush of Merford has given \$10,000 to the house of refuge in that city. It is reported that the Chicago and Milwaukee railroad is likely to get into Michigan. A horse stepped on a fallen electric light wire in New York Thursday and was killed on the spot. Orangeville and Orillia are doing a brisk trade in ice, which they are shipping to the States. Emperor Francis Joseph of Austria appears to have aged twenty years since his son's tragic death. Some thirty persons were killed and many more injured in a Belgian railway wreck Saturday. Black diphtheria is raging near Kent Bridge, Essex county, and in nearly every case proves fatal. Police Inspector Martia was killed at Gweodere, Donegal, Sunday, while arresting Father McFadden. The Northern Pacific is credited with the intention of pushing its line through to Regina as fast as possible. The latest Indianapolis defaulter, County Clerk Sullivan, is said to have made away with over \$100,000. It is reported that the new issue of Panama canal shares is a complete failure. The old shares are quoted at 85 from 100. Owen Sound is having a marine hospital, a grant of \$20,000 having recently been made by the town and county councils for that purpose. W. L. Smith, a well-to-do farmer near Holt, Mich., credited with a fortune, was slain in his barn yard the other day and deliberately drowned himself.
