The Cattle Trade—A Pinin Talk The Cattle Trade-A Plain Talk

> Ald. Frankland, the well-known Tothe Globe:-I would like to speak to the tle in the Province of Ontario who read studying the growing of cattle. For some weeks I have carefully examined the great arrivals of American cattle in Liverpool, or more correctly speaking, Birkenhead, the Chester side of Merney; also in Deptford, on the Thames, London. and they have come in thousands, and they have sold at from 42 to 5 pence per pound in the carease, while the hide. tallow and offal, such as blood, head, heart, tongue and liver, feet and other articles, thrown away in Canada, realise about £2 10s, sterling per animal. Iam told by those interested that notwithstanding this low price in England, and comparative higher freight by sea, they have held their own, because they have been purchased at such low prices in Chicago, Buffalo and Boston. Think of it, Canadian farmers! Good bullocks from two to four years old, Weighing from 1,300 to 1,550 lbs. ayerage, at from \$3.85 to \$4.25 per hundred live weight, while at the same time our Canadian shipping. the same time our Canadian shipping cattle are being bought from \$4.50 to \$5 per hundred, and, I am sorry to say it, they, (the Canadians,) are not so good a sample. Yet from the beginning of May to the end of August, Canadians by their clean bill of health and the inestimable privilege they enjoy of free access alive into British markets, realise from onehalf penny to three farthings per pound more than the grand American beeves; and further, Canadian farmers should understand that American markets will retain the quotations I have given you. And here I should state that bulls have sold correspondingly low, from \$2 to \$3 perhundred. The question will be asked: How do they make it pay? My answer is: They are widely adopting the system urged by Prof. Brown when he had the urged by Frof. Brown when he had the management of the government agricultural farm at Guelph, that is, early maturity—yes, early maturity. The fact has been demonstrated so plainly in many parts of America that they can build up a two-year old steer to weigh 1,360 pounds, living weight, and when slaughtered produces or turns out 734 pounds of beef, the very weight sought after in every part of Great Britain, and rot only wanted in preference to larger carcases, but sells at a slight advance. I have particularly remarked these facts in open markets such as Liverpool, London, Manchester, Leeds, Wakefield, Sheffield, Birmingham and Derby; also in the American beef shambles or abattoirs, when first-class meat purveyors were selecting 20 or 30 carcases, they generally marked right well-developed carcases full of flesh that weighed from 690 to 740 pounds. Then I ask, and if my communication be valuable, this is the pith of my letter: Why should our breeders and feeders of Ontario keep their animals one and two attention they can save twelve and twenty months' feed? Calves when born should never be pesmitted to lose calf flesh. They should improve onward if it is desirable to work on a profitable basis, and considering the domestic nat-ure of our farming and the yaluable blood and breeds we have in Canada, why should we not be able to rank first in this great trade and make it profitable? Bulls, oxen and old cattle are at a discount here, and the trade for such animals will continually get worse. Canada has not yet done her best. But I trust, Mr. Editor, that the influence of the Globe, which all intelligent farmers read and meditate upon, will cause the great question of early maturity to be discussed and studied, so that the wailing cry we so often hear, "There is no money in feeding cattle," will cease, and that four dollars and fifty cents per hundred live weight can be proved to be a paying investment. Ontario and her lands, together with her live stock, stand preeminently high in England. And I should like some day to buy a cargo of grade steers, two-year olds, say 500 head, at the price mentioned, and give the results to the armers through the columns of the Globe. C. F. FRANKLAND.


