The Maritime Farmer.

A few days ago the price of oats at St. John, N.B., was 45 cents, while the price at Boston was only 33 cents. This leads a St. John paper on the N.P. side to ask what the liberals have to say about such state of things. The drought in New Brunswick and Nova Scotia is responsible for the high price of oats there, and if there were a drought every year no doubt the price would always be higher than in Boston. But would such a circumstance be sufficient of itself to show that the maritime farmer was doing so well that he did not require free trade with the States? If not, what is the sense of pointing to the effect of this year's drought as an argument from the farmers side against reciprocity? According to the trade and navigation returns for 1888. New Brunswick exported altogether about \$650,000 worth of agricultural products last year. She sent \$125 worth to Great Britain, \$4,007 worth to the West Indies, \$213 worth to St. Pierre Miquelon, and all the rest, namely, \$644,932 worth, to the United States. Nova Scotia during the same period exported \$1.162,921 worth of agricultural products of her own growth. Her customers were as follows:

If our protectionist friends scream less and think more it might be better for their cause.
