of the government with respect to the agricultural interests of Canada. The bulletin in question dealt most comprehensively with the question of barley, and the lesson it was intended to teach is obvious.

From what has been said as to the absolute necessity of having the two-rowed barley unimpaired it is to be commanded that the quantity of pure seed now available at the several experimental farms is probably sufficient to give to every farmer who will apply for it a three-pound sample.

After mature consideration the government has come to the conclusion that the recommendation of Hon. Mr. Arthur Meighen is desirable to make a large importation of the very finest barley used by the British brewer, and Tuesday it was agreed that the amount of \$250,000 should be placed in the estimates for that purpose.
