HOME AND FOREIGN ITEMS OF INTEREST.

Huronolor, the Alaskan volcano, after a lapse of seven years, is again in a state of great activity.
The Date of Connaught will arrive in Winnipeg at 9 p. m. on May 23, and will leave at noon the following day for Montreal.
A barrel of powder in a burning hardware store in Havana caused the deaths of twenty-two persons and injuries to one hundred others.
In New York on Saturday an Italian, while cleaning a second story window, put his hand on a "live" electric light wire. He gave a shriek, and a second later fell to the sidewalk dead.

A destructive fire occurred recently in Tonk, Siberia, and hundreds of lives were lost. The military remained quietly watching the conflagration, and refused to render any assistance.
Lubeck, Germany, is excited over the mysterious murder of Miss Peterson, a daughter of a prominent lawyer. The body was found in a horribly mutilated condition, with no means of identifying it, and the crime was ascribed to a party who had been seen at the scene.
Respecting the protests sent to Russia against the proposed treatment of prisoners in the Balkans, the British government is shooting down the protests for attending a public meeting.

A case of wholesale poisoning has occurred in Wigan, Saxony, which has caused a great deal of excitement and alarm. Several persons are affected, and the poison is believed to be arsenic. The victims are all men, and the poison was administered in a most insidious manner.
A fatal accident happened in the Bay of Fundy, New Brunswick, on Monday. A large schooner, the "Albatross," was wrecked on the rocks. The vessel was carrying a large quantity of lumber, and the crew were all saved.
