FARMERS' WIVES AND THE ELECTION. The farmers' wives are taking a remarkably lively interest in the South Victoria election, and no wonder. They have heard a good deal about the McKinley bill and the higher duties on barley, horses and other farm products, but they are now receiving proof positive as to the "benefits" of retaliation and the N. P. Colbyism about which the tory speakers fluently orate.

THE NORTH RIDING CANDIDATE. The nomination of "Major Sam Hughes of the Lindsay Warder" by the North Victoria conservative convention was not by any means the unanimous and enthusiastic act the Empire tries to make out. The convention was insufficiently advertised, and no one but the initiated wire-pullers supposed that a candidate would be brought out for a general election now believed to be a year and a half away.
