CRUEL TREATMENT OF CHILDREN.—A good deal of interset was taken in a case before the police court here on Thursday last. Justices Brown and Glendinning presided. Mr. Farswell, county attorney, prosecuted and Mr. Chappelle appeared for the defence. James Martin, who lives about two miles from here, was charged with crueity to his children. It appears that Martin's wife died some six months ago, and he has a woman keeping house for him. The evidence showed that the little children, especially a girl about five years of age, was frequently beaten and abused so that the body was striped with welts, burns and sores. On one occasion the child was tied up from the ground by the hands and suffered great pain until relieved. The kindly neighbors took the matter up and brought the charge against the father. Several respectable witnesses gave teetimony as to the inhuman treatment which the children received. The magistrates were divided about committing the accused for triel, Mr. Brown favoring a committal and Mr. Glendinning being opposed, the charge was therefore dismissed. Mr. Farswell said he would bring the case before a higher court,—[Independent.
