POISONED BY BITTER ALMONDS.

The Baltimore "Sun" of Friday says: "Miss Minnie and Alice Watson, two young ladies, sisters, living on McHenry street, near Market street, South Baltimore, were made seriously ill on Tuesday, by eating cake two highly flavored with extract of bitter almonds. The young ladies baked a cake during the Christmas holidays especially for themselves, and liking the odor as well as the taste of bitter almonds, they used such a large quantity that it was very perceptible to the smell, probably two or three teaspoonfuls. When these three or four drops would have been sufficient. After eating the cake the young ladies were taken violently ill. Dr. J. Bosley prescribed the proper antidote, relieving the patients in a few hours. Both convalesced freely, with local greatly toward recovery. They are now out of danger."

WHAT CAME IN A POTATO.

The Worcester Mass. "Sun" of the 12th of January, says: "A friend of ours received, a day or two ago, through the post office, from Olympia, Washington, Territory, a remarkable specimen of the potato. It was a small tuber, about the size of a large potato. Further investigation showed that the potato had been in the soil for some time, and in the cavity were found flowers and leaves, which, as he learned, were the result of a potato having been planted in a garden in the open air on the 5th day of December. The flowers, panicle, peduncle and stem, were as fresh and bright as if they had been gathered within an hour, though their opening across the continent had spent some time in transit. THE FARM.

Watering Stock. These same cattle were always watered; that is, they had plenty of hay and fodder—the cows were milked twice during the winter—but the effect of the want of sufficient water in the summer in the condition of the stock every spring, and I have often heard the remark, "I do not see why Black cattle are so poor as the others, feed them enough." Very different was it, as a neighbour's mare lay. At this farm a log apparatus carried spring water into a long trough in the yard, where the water seldom froze entirely over, so that the cattle, whenever out in the yard, could take a drink of water any time, consequently will never overdrink and be so chilled and chilled up. I have often watched the sheep, when taking their morning or evening meal of hay, immerse their heads in the water, and drink, and then turn off to the water trough, and drink the water until they are full.
