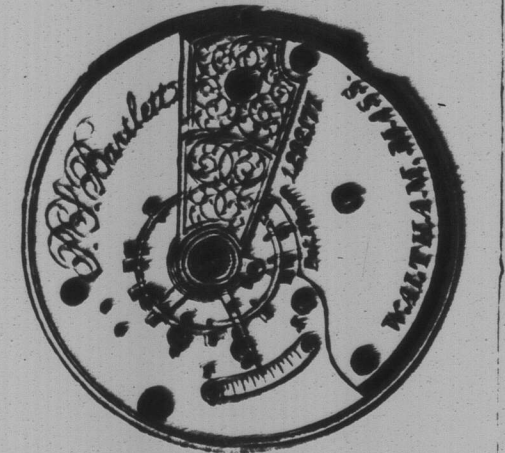

NEW FOUR DOLLAR BILLS.—The new four dollar bills of the Dominion are now ready for issue. The new note is very handsome in appearance. In the centre of the face is an excellent portrait of the Governor General; in the right hand corner an engraving of the great seal of the Dominion, and in the left corner the figure "four." On the back are the words "Dominion of Canada" on the usual ground. The notes are signed, J. M. Courtney, deputy minister of finance.

BUSINESS, though good, does not appear to have so far come up to the expectations of business men throughout this section. In the early fall some very large stocks were laid in and of course to meet their paper merchants required to sell them off at a rapid rate. This not being done has had a tendency to tighten the money market slightly and with the low price of grain makes general business slower. But for all that a steady and safe business is being transacted by every merchant in this district.

The sudden cold snap that began on Saturday will be everywhere welcomed. Everybody is in bristler spirits when the first touch of the coming winter is felt tingling through the blood. The clear, crisp air, freed from the odors of decaying vegetation, the brilliant colors of the autumn leaves, and the brighter face which nature wears compensate for much that is usually disagreeable in the earlier autumn. This fall, however, has given no special reason for complaint.

The people of Stratford have published a little book of a nearly seventy pages, with two maps and with some forty-four striking illustrations, for circulation in the Old World. They contend that Stratford affords valuable advantages for manufacturers and they mean that everybody interested shall know it. The book, which contains much interesting information about Stratford, is the work of a committee of public spirited citizens appointed by the corporation to work up a boom in favor of the town. The above is an idea which might be followed with advantage in other places.
