Adam, Bailey (Emily), Bailey (Lexton), Daniel, Deacon, Fairbank, Hemphill, Hopkins, Howie, Junkin, MacArthur, Miller, Dr. Norris, Spring, Smithson and Walker.

The minutes of the June session were read and approved.

**WARDEN'S ADDRESS.** The Warden in his address stated the object of the council's coming together, being for the purpose of bringing up all the unfinished business as well as the usual important questions which generally come before a municipal body at this time of the year. He had no doubt that it would be conducted in that thorough and judicious manner which characterized the deliberations of the county of Victoria.

**COMMUNICATIONS.** The Warden read the following communications: From Mr. Porteous, of the Bank of Montreal, advising the council of a reduction on the interest allowed on deposits owing to the lowness of the money market.

From Mr. J. E. Evans, asking that repairs to the extent of \$50 be made on the Onemee drill shed building.

From Mr. A. Moffat, asking the council to take steps regarding the separation of Oakley and Draper from the county of Victoria, that they might become a part of the proposed new county of Muskoka.

From the clerk of the county of Ontario, requesting the Victoria county council to unite with Ontario and others in asking the Provincial Government not to make any further grant of money to the Provincial Exhibition, it being considered by them to be throwing away public money.

From the Minister of Education in reference to school matters. Also regarding the establishing high and public model schools in the county.

**PROVINCIAL EXHIBITION GRANT.** Major Deacon gave notice that he would some time during the session move the council into committee of the whole on the Provincial Exhibition grant question. He had noticed that many councils were memorializing the Government regarding this annual grant to the exhibition, but it was a matter of great importance, especially to the farming interests, it was a question that required great consideration.

The council then adjourned till ten o'clock Wednesday morning.

**WEDNESDAY.** Council resumed at 4 p. m., all members present. The minutes of the former meeting were read and approved.

**REPORTS.** Mr. J. S. McArthur presented the report of the special committee appointed by the council to make repairs on the Fenelon Falls bridge, and moved that the council go into committee of the whole on the report.

The council went into committee of the whole on the report. The report stated that according to the authority of the council given to the special committee the bridge had been carefully repaired by new timbers, new stone abutments, and new iron year from the Toronto Bridge Company. So far they had expended \$631.56 on the work and there were some other accounts that had not yet been settled. The bridge had been raised and the approaches thereto had been improved and raised, making the bridge now in a safe and creditable position.

Mr. Heaslip moved the committee rise. He then moved that the report of the committee on the Fenelon Falls bridge be referred to the road and bridge committee, to complete the report and lay before the council later in the session.

Col. Deacon moved in amendment, seconded by Mr. A. Adam, that the report be not adopted but referred back to the committee to complete their list of expenditures, and then refer to the road and bridge committee.

Some discussion ensued regarding some stone used in the abutments and the price that should be paid Mr. Daniels for it, and it was decided to leave the question over for the road and bridge to settle.

Col. Deacon moved, seconded by Mr. Daniels, that the finance report be referred to the council later in the session.

The report recommended the payment of various small accounts; also that no action be taken in the matter of a memorial from the council of Peel in the matter of appeals under the voters' list act; that no action be taken in connection with the memorial from Ontario in reference to the grant to the Provincial exhibition from the Legislature.

Col. Deacon moved, seconded by Mr. Hopkins, that the following memorials be now received and read a first time, viz: To the Commons of Canada praying for an import duty on wool. To the Legislative Assembly of Ontario praying for incorporation of the village of Fenelon Falls into the municipality of Fenelon Falls.

The council then adjourned till 10 o'clock to-morrow.
