LIVES LOST IN BATTLE.—A late French document compiled with care, gives the results of the deaths during some of the most important wars. The Crusades war was estimated to have cost 784,000 lives; the war in Italy in 1857, 45,000; in Schleswig-Holstein, 3,500; the American war, 900,000; the Crimean war, 45,000; Mexico and China, 65,000; the war between France and Prussia in 1870, 1,750,000 lives; and these were men in the prime of life—men who ought to have been useful and productive citizens. Such were the effects of thirteen years of war in this century.
