

Wintering Foals.

Wintering Fuels.

The season is now approaching when the proper treatment of spring feels, during the winter season, is an important question for the consideration of the breeder, and to this end we suggest the following as embodying the result of long and successful experience. It may be set down as a well-settled point that they should be well kept and protected from the storms of winter, but this does not imply that they should be kept constantly housed up and pampered with heating grain. Like all other young and growing animals, they require an abundance of fresh air and exercise, and should have free opportunity of including in the gambols, and frolics, and races to which their nature prompts them, and which is so essential in order to distend the lungs, swell the veins, invigorate the entire system, and make a hardy, healthy, active house. Give musole and bone forming food in abundance, but feed own sparingly, and, if at all, only in the coldest weather. A few cots, turn, hay and carrier, will make a cots grew; and exercise, eith protection from severe storms, will keep him healthy. 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
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
