EXTRA WORK FOR MUNICIPAL OFFICIALS.—Municipal clerks and assessors as a rule do not grow inordinately rich on the salaries paid them by over-generous municipalities, the position, to a very large extent being one of honor rather than profit, and the present year for these officials promises to be even less remunerative than usual, as in accordance with a measure passed at the last session of the Legislature four extra columns have to be put on the assessment roll, viz:—For acres of wood land, for acres of swamp, marsh or waste land, for acres of orchard and garden, and for number of acres under fall wheat.
