Labrador Lighthouse Life. Mr. J. U. Gregory, naval agent at Quebec, has contributed to the New York Forest and Stream some interesting sketches of Labrador life.

I have known a well educated man, born and brought up in Quebec, formerly a storekeeper, married to an educated woman, who accepted a situation as light-house keeper on the Island of Anticosti, and afterward obtained, through family influence, a good government appointment with sufficient remuneration to enable him to bring up his family well and live comfortably, actually shed tears when he left his isolated island home, and a year afterward trying to get back his former position, but I have also known others to go out of their minds from the dreariness and monotony of their lives.

There are others in my district on the coast of Labrador who are possessed of considerable education and even refinement. At the solitary Bird Rock Station, where the lighthouse is perched on a square rock a few hundred feet in extent, which one can reach only by being hauled up in a box by means of a crane 120 feet from the water, the keepers have been sadly tried. The first keeper there, after two years' residence, became insane from the monotony of the life.
