Crushed to Death.

A terrible calamity, involving the death of 173 children, occurred in the town of Sunderland, in the county of Durham, Saturday evening. From the details this far received it appears an entertainment had been given in Victoria hall by a conjuror, which was attended almost altogether by children, several thousand being in attendance. The accident occurred at the close of the performance. The body of the hall had been entirely cleared of its occupants when some twelve hundred little ones came rushing down the stairs from the gallery. At the top of the first flight of stairs there was a door which opened only twenty inches, and thus but one child was permitted to pass through at a time. At this point, while the mass of children were pushing forward one of them fell and was unable to rise owing to the others crowding on. The result was a great number were pushed down, trampled on and suffocated. The scene was terrible, and no effort could stop the mad rush of the afflicted children. They came on pell-mell, though strangely without much shouting, and soon 173 of them were knocked down and suffocated to death by others trampling upon them. The greatest number of bodies which were badly mangled from trampling laid seven or eight feet deep. Many victims and others who were not killed had their clothing torn from their bodies, and this, together with the bleeding bodies of the unfortunates, shows the terrible nature of the struggle. The ages of the 173 children known to have been killed ranged from 4 to 14 years.

The excitement in town when the news of the disaster spread was terrific. Great crowds of people rushed to the scene until at least 20,000 persons surrounded the hall. The feeling was so intense that the authorities ordered out the sixty-eighth infantry to preserve order. The work of getting out the bodies of the victims was begun immediately. They were laid out in the hall, and the parents of those killed were admitted for the purpose of identifying the bodies of the children. The most heart-rending scenes transpired while the work of identification was in progress. The mothers of the dead children constantly uttered piercing shrieks, and many of them fainted on the discovery of the bodies of their little ones.

The staircase from the gallery was a winding one. Both the audience and the officials who were in the hall at the time of the disaster were unaware for considerable time of the terrible tragedy that was being enacted at the door. They were not informed until Graham, the hall-keeper, who was strolling near by the scene of the calamity, was attracted by groans and gave the alarm. Fay, who gave the entertainment, was busy packing up his apparatus to depart when the man rushed up and informed him of the disaster and he immediately fell down speechless in a fit. Some of the families whose homes were suddenly darkened, lost over three children. One man saw his wife pushed their way into the hall in which lay the bodies of victims, and, without betraying any emotion, began to scan the faces of the dead. Recognizing one of the children, the father, pointing with his finger, exclaimed, "that's one." Passing again he recognized another and then a third. Staggering in a fit of agony, he cried, "My God, all my family gone!" and, overwhelmed with grief, sank to the floor. In some homes there are five children dead.

The private secretary to the Queen has telegraphed the Mayor of Sunderland that Her Majesty directs him to state she is terribly shocked at the awful calamity which occurred at Victoria hall on Saturday, and her heart bleeds for the suffering of the many bereaved parents. She prays God to support them in their terrible distress.

Several children who left the exhibition before the accident, state that they saw a man just before the rush partially close the door on the landing on which the disaster took place. It will be proved at the inquest that the man bolted the door ajar in order to facilitate the distribution of toys to the children as they left. The box containing the toys still stands near the door.

Some of the children who escaped say the report spread through the gallery at the close of the performance that the child first out of the hall would get a prize.

A number of deaths occurred since the first report, and the list is now placed at 222.
