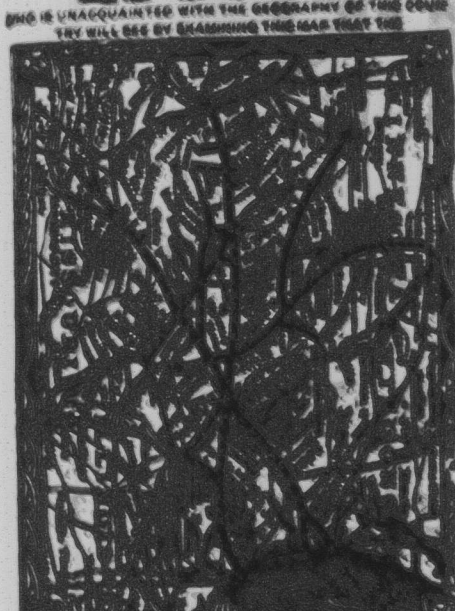


THE MAN
