Several local correspondence letters as well as a quantity of interesting local and editorial matter is unavoidably crowded out this issue.

This week has been one of the most delightful ones as to weather that could possibly be imagined, just cold enough to be enjoyable and clear and bright as summer time.

The Beanbeige was laid up last week for the season. This makes the twentieth season completed by Capt. Lane on these waters and he looks good for twenty more.

The winter trade appears to have fairly started. Business in all lines is reported good and farmers are buying freely. Slaughtering is the one thing painful to lively times till after New Year's.

Firewood is selling in small quantities, and prices are already as low as in the middle of winter last season. Wood is expected to be much cheaper this winter owing to the large quantity of coal now being used in almost every house.

About three years ago the steamer Vanderbilt was burned at her moorings at the Lindsay wharf, and the hull, which sank, and one corner of which was visible above water, was a source of so much danger to other vessels that the government at last determined to have it removed. Efforts were made to let the hull, but as no one would take it for less than \$200, which was thought too much, Mr. Wm. Kennedy, of Boboyagon, who has done a great deal of government work, was employed, and commenced operations early last week. His mode of operation was simple and effective. Having moored a scow each side of the hull, long and strong timbers were extended from one scow to the other and the ends placed on jacks-a-cree. Chairs were then drawn under the hull and fastened to the timbers, which were then raised three or four feet by means of the screws; after which the load was carefully carried to a small barge about a quarter of a mile from the wharf and out of the track of boats and there sunk. The total cost was about \$60, or less than one third of the amount asked by parties invited to tender for the contract.
