To destroy Sorrel, or Sour Grass

All of the advantages of summer-fallowing upon sandy, or light gravelly soil, may be secured not only without loss of elements of fertility, but with essential gain in this respect. It is now September. The field may be plowed and sowed to rye, without manure, or with two hundred pounds of super-phosphate to the acre.

September Hints for Farm and Garden

In laying down a glass of lead to frost, keep the lead between with the steel, leaving them close together.
