The funeral of the late Cardinal McCloskey took place in St. Patrick's cathedral, New York, Thursday morning, the services being presided by Archbishop Gibbons of Baltimore. Over five thousand persons witnessed the solemn ceremony in the cathedral, hundreds being unable to get admittance.

The Soudan, from Liverpool, with 32 emigrants and 44 cabin, 32 intermediate and 132 steerage passengers, arrived at Victoria on Saturday morning.
