Price of Shares.—Whether a company's shares are being sold at par, at a discount, or at a premium, they are always at par in the company's books.

Dividends and Reserves.—It seldom occurs that any properly managed company declares a dividend (division of profits) amounting to the full sum of its earnings.

Dividend Stock.—Dividend stock will be most easily explained by giving an example:—We will suppose that a certain gas company has been in existence a score of years in a prosperous community.

When this has been done for a number of years the capital stock will have greatly increased.

At the credit of profit and loss account there stands—say the sum of \$16,000 as the net profit for the year upon a capital of \$100,000; this is 16 per cent.

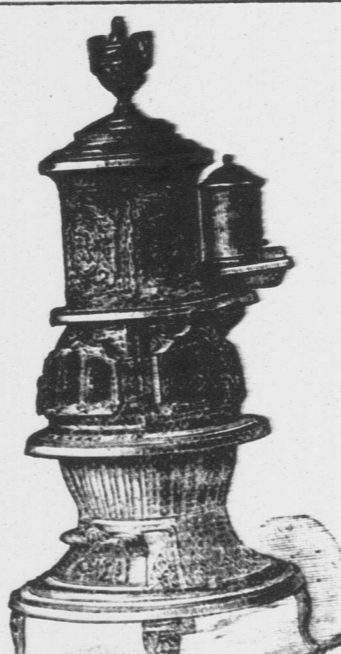
