### Swipes on the Situation.

#### CONTINUED OPENING SERVICES.

On Sunday last the opening services  
were continued in new St. Andrew's  
church. Rev. Dr. Cochrane of Brantford  
occupied the pulpit in the morning and  
evening, delivering interesting, instructive,  
and appropriate sermons. He was  
hospitably met with profound interest by large  
congregations. Dr. Cochrane is admit-  
tedly one of the ablest preachers in the  
Presbyterian church, and it is not sur-  
prising that he has now many admirers in  
Lindsay. In the afternoon the Rev.  
Alfred Gandler of Kingston conducted  
the services, delivering a pointed and  
practical address to the young people—  
of whom there was a large number—  
—on the vanities and follies of the world.

Many reasons have been given for the  
unexpected defeat of the government  
candidate in gerrymandered Victoria. There  
are no doubt many causes which happily  
combined to effect the grand result over  
which we have great reason to rejoice.  
The defeated candidate we shall never  
hear of again, his political career is end-  
ed, his brilliant sun is set under a dark  
cloud of infamy. His arrogance has been  
punished, and the contempt he treacher-  
ously heaped upon the head of a supporter  
has been piled mountains high upon his  
own. Hereafter we shall not deem him  
worthy a single charge of power and shot.  
But the rest of the gang we wish to see  
brought to bay, but not killed, and it  
will be a matter of prudence to keep a  
watchful eye over their movements in  
order to hold the position we have so gal-  
lantly taken. Not one be deceived by  
great pretensions, and fair promises! We  
have bitterly experienced how insincere,  
how hollow and heartless all this is. We  
have in the past been fearfully duped,  
humbly and deceived by that political  
"Sam Slick," S. C. Wood, beneath whose  
impenetrable mask hid the heart of Judas;  
a cold blooded, selfish wirepuller, indiffer-  
ent to all and every thing, but himself.  
We have paid a severe penalty for our  
credulity, now let us be wise and main-  
tain our independent position with a  
manly firmness. It is the only course we  
can take and hold with honor. Let us  
be united, and accept of no compromise.  
We know what we have done, let us not  
forget that we can do it again, if another  
wholesome lesson is required to open the  
eyes of chiques and combinations that have  
been using us as stepping stones for their  
own political advancement or securing  
positions for the dross and imbeciles of  
the party, which they never deserved and  
should never have had. As they get rid of  
weights we were only too glad to get rid  
of them.

#### Descriptive.

The dimensions of the church proper are  
60x77 feet, with Sunday school annexed at  
the rear 25x77 feet. The foundation  
which is heavier than is usually found  
under the largest buildings is of Bobac-  
geon stone throughout with cut stone  
pilings. The church is built of brick,  
with stone and iron facings; the school  
room of the same materials. A tower 35  
feet high finished in castellated style  
graces the north-west corner of the main  
building, on the ground floor of which is  
a commodious vestibule. There is a ves-  
tibule of smaller size in the south-west  
corner. The height of church at eaves is  
30 feet. The auditorium is in amphithe-  
atrical form rising in all directions  
from a raised point in front of the pul-  
pit, the ceiling is in the form of a Gothic  
arch in the nave forty feet high while  
the aisles are groined and ten feet lower,  
all finished in plaster, with elaborate and  
graceful mouldings, and stucco capitals  
on the tops of the iron columns which  
support the roof. The latter is covered  
with slate and surmounted on the ridge  
with iron cresting of pleasing design.  
Messrs. McNeely and Waters were the  
contractors for the building completed  
ready for the reception of the windows and  
furniture. As in all their contracts, so in  
this, thoroughness, neat and faithful at-  
tention to every requirement of the plans  
and specifications have characterized them  
in fulfilling their contract. The building  
was handed over to the committee before  
the time fixed for its completion. Their  
sub-contractors were—For the stone-  
work, Mr. James Bogue of Peterboro; for  
brick work, Mr. James Grouden of Lind-  
say; for plastering, Frederick Reeves &  
Son of Lindsay; and for iron work, Mr.  
W. Howe, all of whom have done their  
work most creditably. Mr. James Mc-  
Laren was foreman on the works and the  
stone dressing was in charge of Mr. John  
Milburn.

#### The windows are of stained glass and

were made by the well-known firm of  
Joseph McCausland & Son. The cathe-  
dral windows in the west wall are of  
specialty beautiful design. In the school  
room two chaste stained windows pre-  
sented by Mr. Wm. Neeldler.  
Mr. E. Woods has supplied the heating  
appliances which consist of two furnaces  
placed below the floors. No patented  
plan has been followed but the result  
shows that Mr. Wm. Woods, under whose  
supervision the furnaces have been erected,  
is skilled in the art of supplying heat  
in public buildings. The same firm has  
supplied the gas fixtures and fittings,  
which are in keeping with the character of  
the auditorium.  
Messrs. McCall and McCall of Toronto  
made the piano which is of chestnut and  
cherry, and the choir seats and pulpit of  
walnut and chestnut. The furniture is  
superior in design and finish and reflects  
the highest credit on the firm.  
The church is furnished with cushions  
of crimson ray, made by the upholsterer  
in Mr. James Hamilton's care. The school  
room has two chaste stained windows pre-  
sented by Mr. Wm. Neeldler.  
A description of the building would not  
be complete without reference to the ex-  
cellent manner in which the architect,  
Mr. Wm. Duffin of Lindsay, has done his  
work in the preparation of plans and su-  
pervision of the construction. The build-  
ing outside and inside speaks for itself of  
his skill as a designer, but the strict at-  
tention to every detail commands Mr.  
Duffin's even more highly. It is gratifying  
to the congregation and creditable to  
the architect to find that the several  
properties of the auditorium are satisfac-  
tory. The total cost, including value of  
site, is close upon \$24,000.
