New Zealand Schools.

Some interesting matters connected with our public school system are brought out in the reports of Southern Inspectors. Inspector Dixon, too, in his annual report on the schools in the Wanganui district, complains of irregularity in attendance, the percentage of absence in Wanganui district being the second highest in the colony.

The work generally, he says, is improved, but he finds fault with some teachers who work up their pupils to an unhealthy state of excitement by constantly holding the examination and the Inspector before them in a threatening manner, in place of having the work regularly and well done week by week, throughout the year.

With reference to the Standard IV., having found for three years that many pupils are unable to do the work of the words of the text, he is of opinion that the book is too difficult, or sufficient time is not given to reading. In the higher standards the pupils seldom read as if they understood the sense of the passages and the parts of the sentences, and to meet that difficulty an suggestion is made that more attention should be paid to analysis and synthesis. The grammar shows a decline and arithmetic is still bad, and the work in these subjects, Mr. Dixon thinks, points out the desirability of an additional standard, so as to reduce the work required in IV., V., and VI. The want of knowledge of local geography and local history is apparent almost everywhere. At some schools the pupils are ignorant of the Queen's name, others of the Governor's; other children give Sir James Vogel and Major Atkinson in answer to a question as to the Governor of the colony.

The annual report of the Inspector for Southern districts to the preparation of a "fourth class" makes a contribution to the work of teaching, or anxious to be so employed; and this, though a higher salary is paid to boys than to girls in the same grades. Of 31 pupils teachers in the Board's service only 11 were boys, and of 25 candidates preparing to become pupil teachers only nine were boys. This is a serious defect, and experience has shown it is no easy task to apply an effectual remedy.
