From every section of North Victoria and Haliburton come reports of serious loss to settlers through bush fires.

The Ontario Government voted \$20,000 nominally for the relief of a few residents of Connemara in Connaught, Ireland, some years ago.

It is proposed to loan the settlers money to be repaid with interest, or after a lapse of years.

The government has obtained from the sale of timber on those lands more than they ever got for the best farming lands.
