Pour Hope and Kingardine Railway.—
As is well known by most of our citizens and very many of the residents of Durham, potitions have been circulated by East Durham's energetic member, Mr. H., A. Ward, praying the Dominion Government to grant a charter to the Central Outario Railway to run from Port Hope to Kincardine. The road will pass through the counties of Lurham, Outario, York, Simose, Grey and Bruce to the harbor of Inverhuren. It will catch the trade from the upper great lakes and will be a quick transit to Oswego and other ports along the country to be passed there are now no railway facilities, and to these the road will be a boon. No bonuses will be asked from the municipalities; the Government bonus of \$2,200 per mile, of course, will be caked for. Col. Tyrwhitt, M. P., of Simose, is working with Mr. Ward in getting the charter.—Port Hope Times.
