Passing Napanee, a very pretty town on the Napanee river and on an arm of the Bay of Quinte, the train soon draws into Kingston. This city is tamous. One of its titles "The Limestone City" gives evidence of its noted quarries of that excellent building material, while another, "The Derry of Canada," affords substantial belief that the majority of residents there are educated in the principles of civil and religious libesty and government. civil and religious liberty and good govern-ment generally. It is the old "Cataraqui" or Fort Frontenec famous in early colonial days. There the Cataraqui river enters the lake; thence the Rideau canal runs to Ottawa; on the rocky Barriefield heights to the east of the city stands in grim silence Fort Henry; on the Peninsula be ween Navy Bay and the Cataraqui lie the Royal Military College and grounds, and Fort Frederick; while spanning grounds, and Fort Frederick; while spanning the water to the city is the old familiar Cataraqui bridge upwards of half a mile long. At the western bridge head are the "Tete du Pont Barracks" the old Fort Frontenac. There are stationed "A" Battery Roval school of Gunnery Numerous martello towers also dot the islands and shores in the city and vicinity. Kingston is also noted as being the seat of Queen's University, an arts, medical and theological institution of the presbyterian church presided over by the prince of preachers and teachers Rev. Dr. Grant. There are few institutions from which have emanated few institutions from which have emanated more broad thinking reasoners than from Queen's. From early days the teaching there has been characterized by its great breadth and depth. The Provincial Penitentiary and

an asylum are also located there.

But, though noted in many respects yet for none is Kingston more justly famous or honored than for being the constituency represented ed than for being the constituency represented by Canada's greatest statesman, the Right Honorable Sir John A. Macdonald. It was there as young Macdonald he studied law; it was in Kingston as volunteer in 1837 8 that the loyal Scotch-Canadian blood was stirred in defence of his country; and it was there he practised his profession and became member of parliament. Not only to day but in years hence will Kingston's associations with Sir John Macdonald be among its brightest recol-

Hon. Oliver Mowat, the premier of Ontario, also honors Kingston in having been there educated. His associations however have been more with Toronto. Among the many causes of notoriety or of prominence to King-aton not by any means the least is Arch-bishop Cleary. He has caused Kingston to be known far and wide. The Kingston locomoknown far and wide. The Kingston locomotive works are an important industry; they are under the presidency of Hon. Geo. A. Kirkpatrick one of Canada's best soldiers and parliamentarians. Situated at the foot of lake and the head of river navigation Kingston is essentially a shipping port. Thence steamers run daily to Ottawa, Montreal, Bay of Quinte ports. Toronto, Oswego, St. Lawrence river and Thousand Islands resor's, everywhere. The fleet of merchant vessels sailing from Kingston angaged in the carrying trade is very Kingston engaged in the carrying trade is very great. Capt. John Gaskin one of the ablest of Canadians is leader in Kingston's shipping industry, and is a born manager of men and At Kingston a pullman is detached from the

night train with passengers for the Richelieu and Ontario steamers for the trip through the "Thousand Islands" and down the long series of rapids to Montreal. These are simply indescribable. They include "Rapide du Plat," "Long Sault," "Coteau," "Cascadea," "Cedars," and "Lachine." To be realized they must be seen and traversed. East of Kingston the country is not so rich
