The assertion is made that the President intends to submit the matter to Congress in a message which will implicate if it does not state explicitly a desire to receive Congressional sanction in forcing Ragland to a position where it would be obliged either to fight in defending Cansdian vessels attacked on the high seas or else to abandon Canada.

The cause of this quarrel is a pitiful one—a matter of wrongfully extending the privileges of a few capitalists who have a complete memoploy at the expense of the people of the United States. The stand taken by Mr. Blaine is the untenable one that these capitalists have a monopoly not only of the scale in our territory and within the marine league or cannon shot of our coast or headlands, which the law of nations recognizes as our jurisdiction, but also of all scale in the part of the North Pacific known as Behring Sea. Under the law of nations, as universally admitted, our jurisdiction over the sea extends no further than the shot of our cannon from the coast. A sea is "closed" if our cannon on either coast at its entrance cover the distance sea is "closed" if our cannon on either conet at its entrance cover the distance with their shot. The single cannon shot in international law is the marine league. We cannot shoot across the North Pacific at any point between our headlands, and the only jurisdiction we have over it is therefore either piratical, as when we seize the ships of a country with which we are at peace, or, under the laws of war, when we seize or attack the ships of an enemy. Seizures made heretofore on the high seas in this connection have been piratical, and England and Canada have shown the greatest forbearance have shown the greatest forbearance—explainable to some extent by the ludi-erous feature of the seizure in which, after the prize is plundered, a prize crew

after the prize is plundered, a prize crew of one man is put on it.

This is the case as it stands, and the whole of it. Undoubtedly, if we go on firing on and boarding English vessels in the interest of the Behring Sea monopoly, we will have to fight in that interest. The money matter involved is of some hundred thousands a year to the Treasury, and of a million or so a year to the capitalists who have this monopoly. 
