If the property is not claimed within one year, and should not exceed fifty dollars in the same up; if over fifty dollars, it shall be adverticed by the justices and told, and the excess of all expenses shall be paid over to the county treasurer. Any person taking up an estray and neglecting to cause the same to be adverticed and appraised, shall be liable to a fixe of twenty dollars. The estray law applies also to any other personal property which may be found in like manney.




