But, Lindsay should be able to get on the right side of the Almighty just as well as Toronto. True both places are taxed to death not for religion but for churches; but Lindsay might submit a plan, we think, which financially would impress the Divine Architect favorably. Suppose on the expiration of the term of the present popular pastor of Cambridge street Methodist church that the two congregations St. Andrew's presbyterian and Cambridge street Methodist were both to become Christian, and retain the services of Mr. Johnston! It is generally believed that there is not much difference between the general run of protestant churches and Christ's teaching, though some of them are fast following romanism back to heathen idolatry. This would be a step in advance. We trust the prying public is trying to advance the movement, but we cannot promise that our influence in that direction is especially powerful. DEATH OF MR. JOSEPH FRY.—Our citizens were shocked beyond measure on Friday evening last by the sudden death of Mr. Joseph Fry. It will be remembered that a couple of months since he got his thigh broken, and the confinement to one position for several weeks produced an accumulation of matter on his lungs that had alarming effects. Dr. Simpson of Lindsay, was called in consultation with Dr. Curry, and afterwards Dr. McAlpine of Lindsay, and Dr. Graham of Fenselton Falls, were also called in consultation, when an operation was performed and the matter withdrawn, which resulted in apparent relief—unfortunately during one of his severe attacks the fractured limb was again separated, but was carefully and successfully reduced by the untiring professional skill of Dr. Curry, McAlpine and Graham, and the patient seemed progressing most favorably; he was, however, subject to occasional prostration and a weak heart, but the more alarming features of the trouble seemed to have entirely disappeared, so confident of his improvement and ultimate recovery were his family, that his brother, Mr. Wm. Fry, who had been waiting most anxiously upon him for a couple of weeks (having been granted leave of absence from his duty as conductor on the G. T. R. for that purpose) started for his home in Haliburton on Friday afternoon, but ere he reached there, a telegram informing him of the death of his brother, had got ahead of him, and he immediately returned to relieve his sister-in-law in the arrangements for the interment of his deceased brother. The body was taken on Saturday morning to Port Hope to be interred in the family burying ground. His brother Oddifield, accompanied his remains to the G. T. R. Station and sent a deputation to Port Hope, who accompanied the family to lay him in his last resting place. We but feel the general sentiment of the respectable portion of this entire community, when we say there is a universal and deep sympathy felt for the widow and three infant children in their sad bereavement, and a most pronounced condemnation of the lawless vagabondism that was the prime cause of the injury, whose fatal termination is so disastrous to the welfare of the loved ones, who looked to him for guidance and support.—Minden Echo, Friday Dec. 9th.

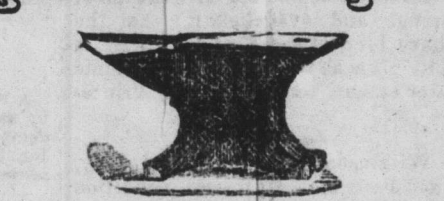
