On completing his time he worked in several places at his trade finally settling in Lindsay in 1856, shortly after which he was united in marriage with Miss Jane Langton, also of Lunenburg county who survives him. Mr. Anderson was a brother of Rev. W. K. Anderson, former of Lindsay, and was senior member of the firm of Anderson, Nutcutt & Co., cabinet makers and undertakers. The funeral on Sunday to Riverside cemetery was largely attended.
