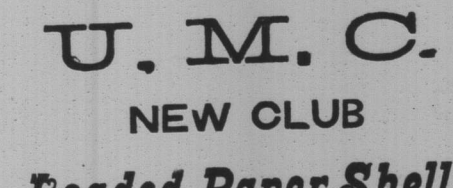

**IN HIS ABLE SKETCH** in the Toronto Daily Mail of Mr. Charles McIntosh, M.P., of Ottawa, soon to become Lt. Governor of the North West Territories, Mr. R. M. McLeod of the Ottawa Citizen relates a few anecdotes. There are a few not related, among them the following. In the bye-election for the late Adam Hurd in the Victoria constituency in the spring of 1887, Mr. McIntosh took part.
