THE CHEMICAL SCHEDULE. In the chemical schedule we have transferred to the free list quite a number of articles used in manufactures, the most important of which is sulphuric acid, one of the corner stones of all chemical industry. The duty on easter oil is reduced from 85 to 35 cents per gallon, and the duty on linseed oil, which was secretly raised to 32 cents by the conference committee on the McKinley Bill, after each house had openly voted a lower duty, we put at 15 cents a gallon. Pig lead being reduced from 2 to 1 cent a pound, lead

paints are correspondingly reduced.

The McKinley Bill increased the duty on opium prepared for smoking to \$12 a pound, in the vain hope of lessening its importation. The custom house officials on the Pacific coast declare this increase of data has simply placed in the hands of of duty has simply placed in the hands of smugglers the bringing in of opium to the demoralization of the customs service, and the loss of over half a million in revenue. The duty proposed is believed to be col-lectable, and will put the traffic under Government control and supervision.

IN THE POTTERY SCHEDULE substantial reductions are made. Plain white ware is dropped from the high schedule 12 which it mysteriously crowd-ed itself.
