Both Sides of the Question An interesting controversy has been taking place in the Globe, between Mr. W. T. R. Preston and Mr. Frank S. Spence, on the suffect of prohibition. Mr. Preston wrote a letter to the Globe reporting the impressions made on him against prohibitory laws by what he saw in a recent visit to Iowa. It was undenisbly a partial and one sided letter His main point was that the law was extensively broken, and Omaha, under the license system, was held up as an illustration of a far better state of things. To this Mr. Spence replied, showing that Omaha was very far from being a model city, and maintaining that the prohibitory law did not get fair play; but that where it was fairly entered it had done much good. To this Mr. Preston replied piling up alleged testimony as to the failure of prohibition in Iowa and Kassas and charging prohibitionists here with conce-ling from the people the real state of things. This last charge was not only untrue, it came with bad grace from Mr. Preston, for he seems to have been unable to hear or see anything but what was against prohibition. To this Mr. Spence has replied. 


