OAKWOOD FREEMEN ARE PATRONS NO LONGER.

Victoria county has, all in all, as grand a race of freemen as grace any locality in America, and those of Mariposa are no exception to the rule.

Last week when the official organ of the patrons of industry came to hand containing the bold announcement of the tyrannical resolution passed two weeks ago by the grand lodge of patrons, and commented on in last week's WARDER, there was great indignation in the breast of every intelligent, independent patron of industry.

When the Oakwood patrons lodge met on Wednesday evening the same old spirit which gave England her John Hampdens and Oliver Cromwells, Scotland her "Bruce and Wallace right", and Ireland her heroes of Derry and Enniskillen, stirred the hearts and minds of their descendants, noble sons and daughters in Mariposa. Accordingly they took the first opportunity of exercising their rights as freemen and, resenting such tyranny as is displayed by the patron leaders, unanimously disbanded the lodge. The funds on hand were applied to a supper, after the dissolution.

The action of Oakwood patrons of industry is typical of the conduct of every freeman not a mere self-seeker or blinded follower in that organization, and the noble conduct of the Oakwood men is rapidly being exemplified in all quarters. Commenting on our last week's article several patrons of industry have assured us we are correct regarding country or town merchants being able to sell as cheaply for spot cash always, as the "supply stores" away in distant centres of the patrons do. They are gradually looking on both sides of the picture, and see that the front is chiefly gilt. The independent free spirit of Mariposa is commendable.

PARTY GOVERNMENT.

One frequently hears some clergymen, some ambitious politicians, some who have axes to grind, or who have been passed over for better men, deny PARTY government. Examination reveals the fact that each and all advocating the overthrow of party are tyrannical in nature, or uninformed in politics, or disgruntled because the public have not fallen down and worshipped at their shrine. It is not necessary at this late stage of the 19th century to advocate the cause of party government. That was established by the accession of William III, by the American War of Independence, by the glorious French Revolution, and by the records of party government in every civilized land. The only persons opposing "party" government are the leaders of the patrons of industry, the barbarian kings of Africa, Asiatic and Cannibal Island nations, the pope of Rome, the anarchist leaders and other tyrannical or semi-informed persons.

Civilized lands have long adopted party government. The few clergymen ranting against it would doubtless favor a return to the good old days when the priest or preacher was "boss of the entire shanty." But, the leaders of thought in all churches to-day are strong advocates of party government. Those opposed to it are merely a few without sufficient talent to excite notice in any other way; who cannot advance arguments for their assertions, and who depend on the prestige given them by a few cent white neck-tie to make wild assertions in the hope that the audience may shut their eyes and

open their mouths and swallow all the clerical pills dropped in.

The facts are these. Examine those in Canada decriing "party" government and they will be found chiefly grits who are sick at heart of the blundering and incapacity of their leaders, yet who have not sufficient independence to stand out from their party and ally themselves with the liberal-conservatives. The patron leaders are all disgruntled grits. The only Tories disgruntled are D'Alton McCarthy and his henchman Col. O'Brien who counts for nothing. Mr. McCarthy as is well known comes under the heading of "disgruntled." In his own opinion, but in no other person's, he should be Premier of Canada. Therefore, jealousy of Sir John Thompson has unbalanced whatever judgment Sir John Macdonald managed to cultivate in Mr. McCarthy.

If minor evils exist in a party, and such are certain to crop out, they can be remedied from within. Such is the practice of the conservative party. If great evils are found out, there are two courses, the conservative one of remedying the evil and punishing the offender; and the reform mode of whitewashing the offence and of promoting the culprit. In such cases the true course for independent reformers, after seeing their efforts to reform their own party are hopeless, is to ally themselves with the liberal-conservatives as the Duke of Devonshire, the Marquis of Hartington, Right Hon. Joseph Chamberlain and the great body of Liberal-Unionists in Great Britain have done. Had those noble leaders acted as the patron leaders and Mr. McCarthy are acting, and tried to form a third party, they would have been playing the Jesuit game, just as the Irish Home Rulers are doing. The creation of new parties is a Jesuit game all through. It tends to produce that unrest, discontent and chaos so fruitful of ignorance and superstition.

Let Canadian farmers and townsmen teach all disgruntled or ill-informed leaders that they have faith in party government.

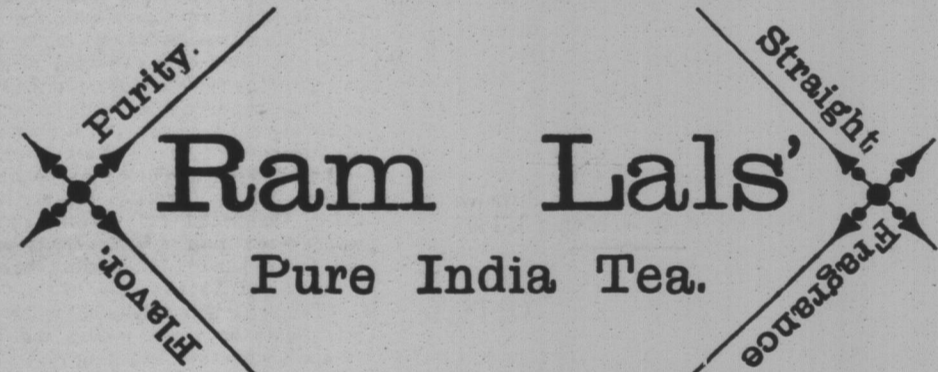
