President Carnot Assassinated.

the Republic, was stabbed mortally at 9.15 this evening, in Lyons, by Cosrio Santo, an Italian Auarchist, 21 years of age.

President Carnot went to Lyons to visit the Exhibition. He left the Chamber of Commerce banquet given in his honor shortly after 9 c'clock and walked to his carriage, which was waiting in the Place de la Bourse. He had hardly taken his seat when Sauto, with a newspaper in his hand, passed through the crowd and sprang up the carriage steps, President Carnot started slightly. Santo snatched a dogger from the newspaper and plunged it into the President's abdomen near the liver. The President sank back unconscious. He was taken at once to the Prefecture and the most skilful surgeons in the city were summened. Meantime Santo was arrested.

HAD TO PROTECT THE ITALIAN CONSULATE. The news spread swiftly tn every part of the city. Infuriated crowds filled the streets. Before 10 c'clock an Italian restaurant had been sacked and the police were obliged to strain every nerve to protect the Italian

LYONS HAD WELCOMED CARNOT ENTHUSIAS. TICALLY.

President Carnot arrived in Lyons yesterday and intended to remain there over Tuesday. He was accompanied by Gen. Borius, chief of his military household, most of his other hosehold officials, Premier Dupuy, M. Burdeau and other members of the Cabinet. He was received enthusiastically at the station by the mayor and district officials, who escorted him and his party to the Hotel de Vills. Cheering crowds filled the streets and gave the President such a welcome as he had seldom received. TRIED TO TEAR THE ASSASSIN TO PIECES. The demonstrative effect of the crowd caused the confusion which gave Santo his apportunity, as he was able to push his way of the summer, and we hardly knew he has had no dysenforward, quite unnoticed until at the step of the carriage. As Santo sprang from the carriage step and tried to escape he was seized and surrounded. But for the prompt interference of the police he would have been torn and trampled to death on the spot. As soon as the police extricated him from the hands of his captors they hurried him off to the station

The President had repeated hemorrhages after he was removed to the Prefecture. He sank gradually but steadily until 12 45 o'clock, when he died. Mme. Carnot and her two sons left Paris at 11.57 o'clock by special train for Lyons. All the Ministers who did not go to Lyons with the President were in council at the Elysee at midnight. Pontypridd. It is estimated that 200 miners were killed either by the explosion or by falling earth and rock. The bodies of 13 dead miners were first raised to the surface of the pit and placed in a shed near the mouth of the shaft. While the crowd was assembled about the shed 20 men and boys in a semi-sometious condition were brought up.

The rescuers reported that they have seen a number of bodies so pinned under the debris that it is impossible as yet to extricate them.

Cardiff, June 24.—The men who have volunteered to search the Albion colliery at Cilifyndd, the scene of the terrible explosion of fire damp last evening, have been at work all day. All hope for those still in the pit has been abandoned. The number of the dead will, it is believed, reach 250. It has been ascertained that 267 men and boys descended the shaft yesterday, and of this number only 17 have been saved. Late this evening the rescuing parties succeeded in extricating a large number of bodies, all of which were sent to the scriace. This far 142 bodies have been taken from the pit. 
