Every kind of business, except preaching, must suspend absolutely on Sunday, and about the only legal thing a citizen can do is to go to church, and he must be very careful to go there in legal feshion. Strest cars, omnibuses, cabs, and all public conveyances stop runing Sundays, and it is against the law to hire a rig at a livery stable. The only way to get around is to walk, and the people wearily plod out to the city's beautiful park and are so tired when they get there they are entirely unable to walk about in it and appreciate its attractions. I don't know if its against the law for a man to use his own carriage on the streets on Sandays, but I don't remember seeing any vehicles about during many Sundays I have been there. Everybody walks Maybe it's against the law to run; I wouldn't be surprised. The saloons, of course, are closed tight and saloons, of course, are closed tight and totally. They close up early Saturday night—about 8 o'clock, I believe, in order to remove temptation from the path of the workingman just in possession of his wages—and remain closed until Monday morning.
