

That a suitable place is required is conceded by every one that has given the matter a moments consideration, but that the building proposed to be purchased is totally unsuitable is the opinion of a large majority of the ratepayers. The building if purchased should be moved to the rear of the lot to give a breathing space for the inmates, it now being close on the street line, an operation which it is questionable the old house would stand. To make it comfortable the clapboarding should be taken off and sheeted up underneath, as thirty-five or forty years ago when it was built the siding was nailed on to the studding.
